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Frederick Amrine is Professor of German Literature at the University of Michigan and a life long scholar of Rudolf Steiner. His research has been devoted primarily to Gœthe, German Idealism and the emerging fields of literature and Science. His formal training includes an undergraduate work in English literature and substantial graduate work in Philosophy and Classics at Cambridge University. Professor Amrine has won several awards for teaching; he holds currently a prestigious Arthur Thurnau Professorship in German, one of the University's highest awards for teaching.



Cécile Allemand teaches music and singing at Institut Rudolf Steiner in Quebec. After training in music and bassoon at the Conservatory of Music of Saint Etienne in France, she studied as a choir conductor with several teachers in France and Quebec and got her Master degree. She continued her studies in singing at The School of Uncovering the Voice with master teacher, Christiaan Boele, in Lahti, Finland. At present she conducts several choirs of children and adults in Québec.
