Christof Wiechert was a Pupil at the Waldorf School in The Hague, Netherlands. After studying education and geography, he spent 30 years of teaching at the Waldorf School in The Hague. During this time he was a co-founder of the Dutch State Waldorf Teacher Training Seminar. For many years he was a Council member in the Anthroposophical Society in the Netherlands. Together with Ate Koopmans he developed the “Art of Child Study” course. He has lectured worldwide.

Since September 1999 he has worked for the Pedagogical Section, from October 2001 to December 2010 as head of the Educational Department of the School of Spiritual Science at the Goetheanum in Dornach, Switzerland. He now continues to work for the School of Spiritual Science at the Goetheanum.

Irène Morzadec-François has developed her experience in Waldorf pedagogy since 1975, teaching at different levels, as a class teacher, a high school teacher in Literature, Philosophy, Aesthetics and History, as a mentor and a teacher trainer, in different countries throughout Europe and North America. She is the Program Director at Institut Rudolf Steiner au Québec.

Michèle Arsenault is the Administrator of Institut Rudolf Steiner au Québec and she teaches the disciplines of Bothmer Gymnastics and Spacial Dynamics®. She embraced Waldorf Education at the Rudolf Steiner School in Montreal and went then for her training with Jaimen McMillan at the Spacial Dynamics Institute in the United States. She is the pioneer in Quebec of that art of movement.

Cécile Allemand studied as a choir conductor with several teachers in France and Quebec. She continued her studies in singing at The School of Uncovering the Voice with the master teacher, Christiaan Boele, in Lahti, Finland. Since 1999 she has been teaching Werbeck singing at Institut Rudolf Steiner au Québec. She currently conducts several choirs of children and adults in Québec.

Pascale Verstrepen, pianist by training, devotes herself mainly to accompany singers and instrumentalists. Two years in a row (2000 and 2001), she was the recipient of the Nicole-Junca scholarship. She has been accompanying eurythmy classes at the Rudolf Steiner School in Montreal for 10 years. She is also an organist and musical director of the Equi Vox Montreal and Polumnia choirs.
